Kia Ora Parents, Caregivers & Whanau,

However, over this term there is a growing pocket of whanau who are causing concern and are taking liberty of our goodwill. I remind you that it is a legal requirement that all children who are of school age, attend school regularly and that any absences must be explained. From today, we will be even more stringent in procedures. This could involve legal action.
