Our team will be departing from school at 8.15am






Parent-teacher interviews will be held at the following times:

To book your interviews, either use the QR code above with a smartphone camera to take you directly to the booking page, or go to www.schoolinterviews.co.nz/code in your browser, and enter the event code **mdubr**

Then follow these three simple steps:

1  Enter your details	First enter your details. If you need to book for more than one student, change the "Book for x students" setting, and enter the other student's name.
2  Choose teachers	On the next page, pick the teacher you want to meet.
3  Choose times	Then you'll see a timetable showing when your chosen teacher is available. Simply click on the time that suits you.

When you have finished, your interview timetable will be emailed to you. You can return to the site and enter the event code **mdubr** again to change or cancel your interviews.

If you don't have internet access, please call the school office - **phone 0800 825 392** and they will be able to make a booking for you.

Age Group: From ages 3 up. We recommend ages 3-8 need a 18+ ticket holder with them on the course at all times.

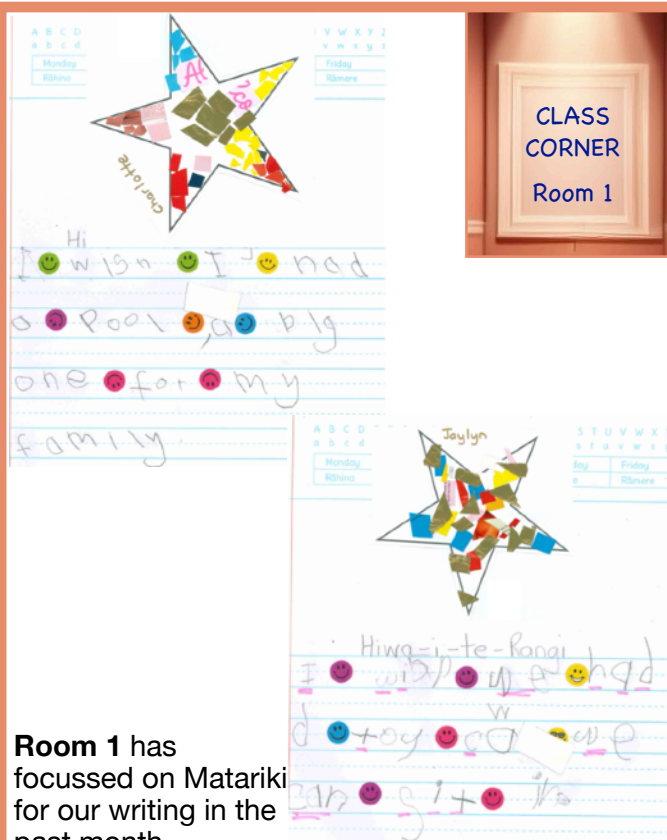

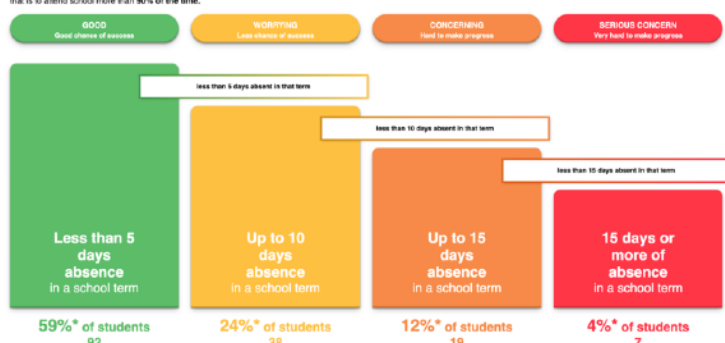
