Kia Ora Parents, Caregivers and Whānau,

Level 2 Safety Rules

It is vital we all follow the rules, including whānau members, when coming to school. For those who need reminding, they are:

- Please stay home if you are unwell.
- Safe hygiene practices must be followed when at school washing hands regularly, coughing etiquette and distancing when possible.
- No one is permitted on to school grounds with the exception of students and staff. All visitors, including parents, caregivers and whanau, must check in at the office on arrival.
- When dropping off or collecting children, please wait in your vehicle or if on foot, waiting at the front entry of the school maintaining a safe distance from others.
- If you have any concerns in regard to your child's return, we encourage you to contact the office.

School Uniform

Due to COVID-19, there has been a hold up with our current winter supply from our uniform company. Unfortunately they will not be available for at least another two weeks. We understand that many of our whānau are waiting on items from this order. To that end, Merivale School Board Of Trustees has decided that until the delivery arrives, students who do not have the correct uniform have permission to wear dark pants/trousers and dark jerseys/hoodies. These items must have little to no writing or logos on them. Once the supply arrives, the correct school uniform will need to be worn. A price list is available at the office for those needing to purchase items.
