The Public Health Nurses are coming back into school twice weekly to continue with swabbing throats for Group A strep as part of the rheumatic fever prevention programme.

There has been an increase in the number of cases over the past 6 weeks. If your children have not returned to school and they have been complaining of a sore throat please contact Jan in the school office and she will make arrangements for a public health nurse to visit your home to swab their throat if you are unable to take them to the doctor.

Please note that this is not a COVID test.

As we get back into school life, please remember to be regularly checking your child's hair for headlice and treating if necessary. We have free treatment shampoo and combs in the school office available to all.
