Kia Ora Parents, Caregivers and Whanau,

With the increase of positive cases in Tauranga, it won't be long before it finds its way to the Vale. In light of this, it is an important reminder to please ensure you keep updated with what is happening at school.

Red Light Rules. These are in place to protect us and have been directed by the Ministry of Education. As a government organisation, Merivale School must follow the rules so please do not be offended if asked to abide them. They are as follows:

- Please keep children at home if they are unwell. Should they arrive at school unwell we will be contacting caregivers to collect them.
- Safe hygiene practices must be followed when at school - washing hands regularly, using sanitiser on entry to the school and classes, coughing etiquette and distancing when possible.
- No one is permitted on to school grounds with the exception of students and staff OR at the discretion of the Principal.
- **All visitors**, including parents, caregivers and whanau, must check in on arrival.
- Face masks are to be worn by all visitors.
- Students and staff may choose to wear masks when outdoors.
- When dropping off or collecting children, parents/caregivers must wait in vehicles or if on foot, waiting at the front entry of the school maintaining a safe distance from others AND wearing masks.
- If you have any concerns in regard to a child's return, we encourage contact with the office.
 We have also sent out on our website and Facebook page a guide for parents and caregivers of what to do should your child become a positive case or be exposed to one.
