## Health & Well Being :

### A reminder that we have the school based **Throat-Swabbing - Rheumatic Fever** programme and also the **Kiri Ora Skin Health** programme operating in our school.

The Strep A bacteria can lead to Rheumatic Fever and may be found in sore throats and skin infections. If left untreated it can lead to Rheumatic Heart Disease.

## Rheumatic Fever and Rheumatic Heart Disease are highly preventable.

The Strep Throat programme will consist of a simple swab being taken of your child's throat. The Kiri Ora programme will consist of an assessment of sore/s.

This service will be offered to all students at the school. If you wish to <u>opt your child out</u> of this programme, can you please complete an opt-off form at the school office.

 School sores - we have had a few cases of school sores since we returned from the holidays. If your child is infected with sores they must come to school with them covered and please make sure you are getting treatment for them.

The above programme can help with this.

 Headlice – we have also noticed an increase in cases of headlice since the holidays. It would be great if everyone could check their childrens hair and treat where necessary please. Reminder that we have free product here at school.
