

Kaiako Learning Focus this week.

We are never too old to learn. This week all staff worked with Nik Smith a Resource Teacher of Learning Behaviour looking at the Five Pillars of Belonging. These are, feeling welcomed, being known, included, supported and connected. We looked at what they look like, feel like and sound like for us as a kaiako at Merivale School Te Kura o Tūtarawānanga.

Using the Five Pillars of Belonging we looked at the ways we make our tamariki feel a sense of belonging when they are in our kura. From this the kaiako will ask the tamariki what they do to ensure when working and playing alongside their peers and other tamariki that they have a sense of belonging. This is building onto the V.A.L.E way which is our foundation for our behavioural expectations.

At Friday's hui-a-kura the Tohu Kaitiakitanga award was awarded for the first time. After school each day Whaea Bex has been closely looking at the decks outside each classroom.

Over the week each class can earn up to 40 points. Points are taken off if there is rubbish, clothes etc left on the deck at the end of the day. Last week was amazing, all decks were much improved. Whaea Bex saw very tidy decks with clothes, food scraps, paper etc put into the correct place.
