Remembrance Garden

A huge thank you to Matua Richard for his work on this project.

The pou that had been removed from the front of the school have been positioned in the garden and will now be kaitiaki for the area. After discussion with the students from Awanui they have decided they would like to repaint them in red, white and black. Awanui students have also been very busy finding out how to make decorative cobblestones that will become part of the garden. I watched them making the moulds, mixing the concrete, dyeing it, embedding a variety of objects into their mould and pouring in the wet concrete. Keep an eye out for these in the garden. Another addition to the garden has been the planting of a kowhai tree. We are hoping that in time this will attract tui to sit in its branches and sing.

Road Safety for our Tamariki.

This term I attended a meeting with representatives from the Tauranga City Council looking at more ways to move in Merivale, Tauranga South, Gate Pa and Greerton. The main driver was making improvements so our tamariki could move more safely around our roads which are in close proximity to our kura. I was very pleased to receive an email that stated that our kura is the only kura that has had funding secured for the below upgrades to take place:

- Raised Crossing on Kesteven near roundabout
- New Footpath on the opposite side of the road
- Another raised crossing near roundabout on Fraser Street
- Relocating existing bus stop and bus shelter 1 block down

This is great news for us all. We will keep you updated on when this work will begin.
